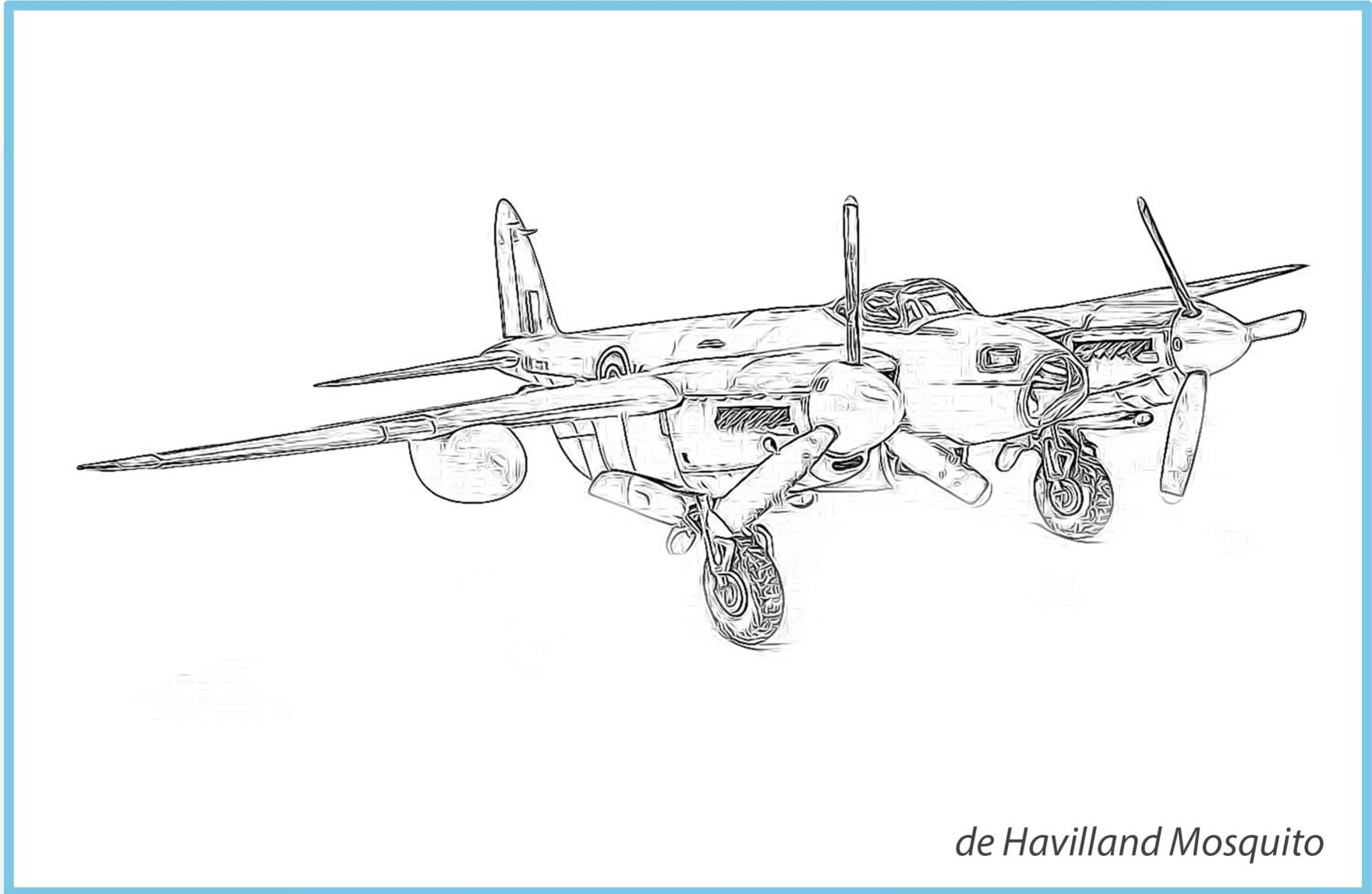

## Rank [*Flight sergeant*]

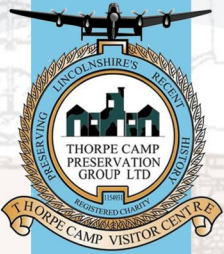

# Thorpe Camp Aircraft Recognition Rank [Warrant Officer]

**Warrant Officer** (WO) in the British Armed Forces is a member of the highest group of non-commissioned ranks, holding the Queen's (or King's) warrant, which is signed by the Secretary of State for Defence. Warrant officers are not saluted, because they do not hold the Queen's Commission, but they are addressed as "Sir" or "Ma'am" by subordinates.

## THE IMPORTANCE OF AIRCRAFT RECOGNITION

Shooting down a plane means shooting down the right plane. Aircraft recognition was, and still is, a vital military skill. It means learning the external appearance of aircraft, both friendly and hostile. WW2 AA gunners also learnt the speeds of aircraft and so knew where to 'aim off'.
